## 2. DISK JOCKEY

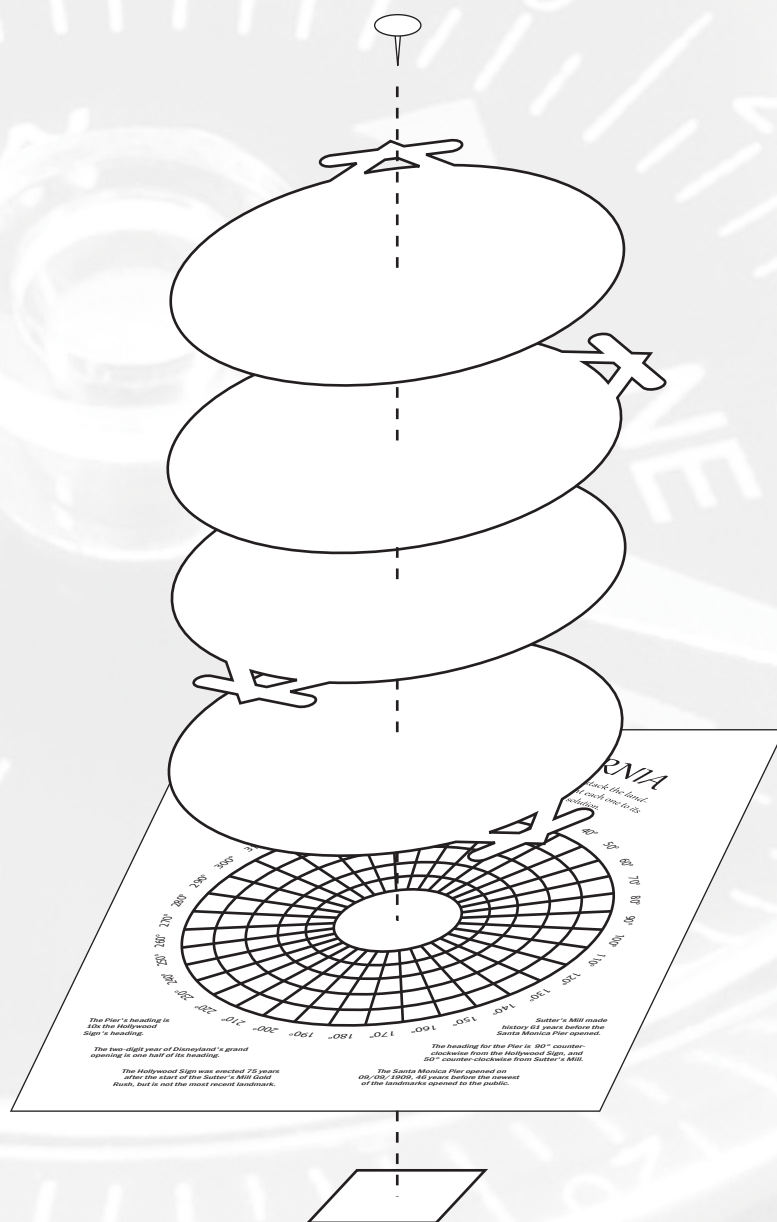
Using the clues on the base sheet, stack the landmark disks from oldest (on the bottom) to newest (on the top).

Insert the thumbtack through the center of each disk, through the center of the base sheet, and finally, into the cardboard square (to avoid marring the table and any stray fingers).

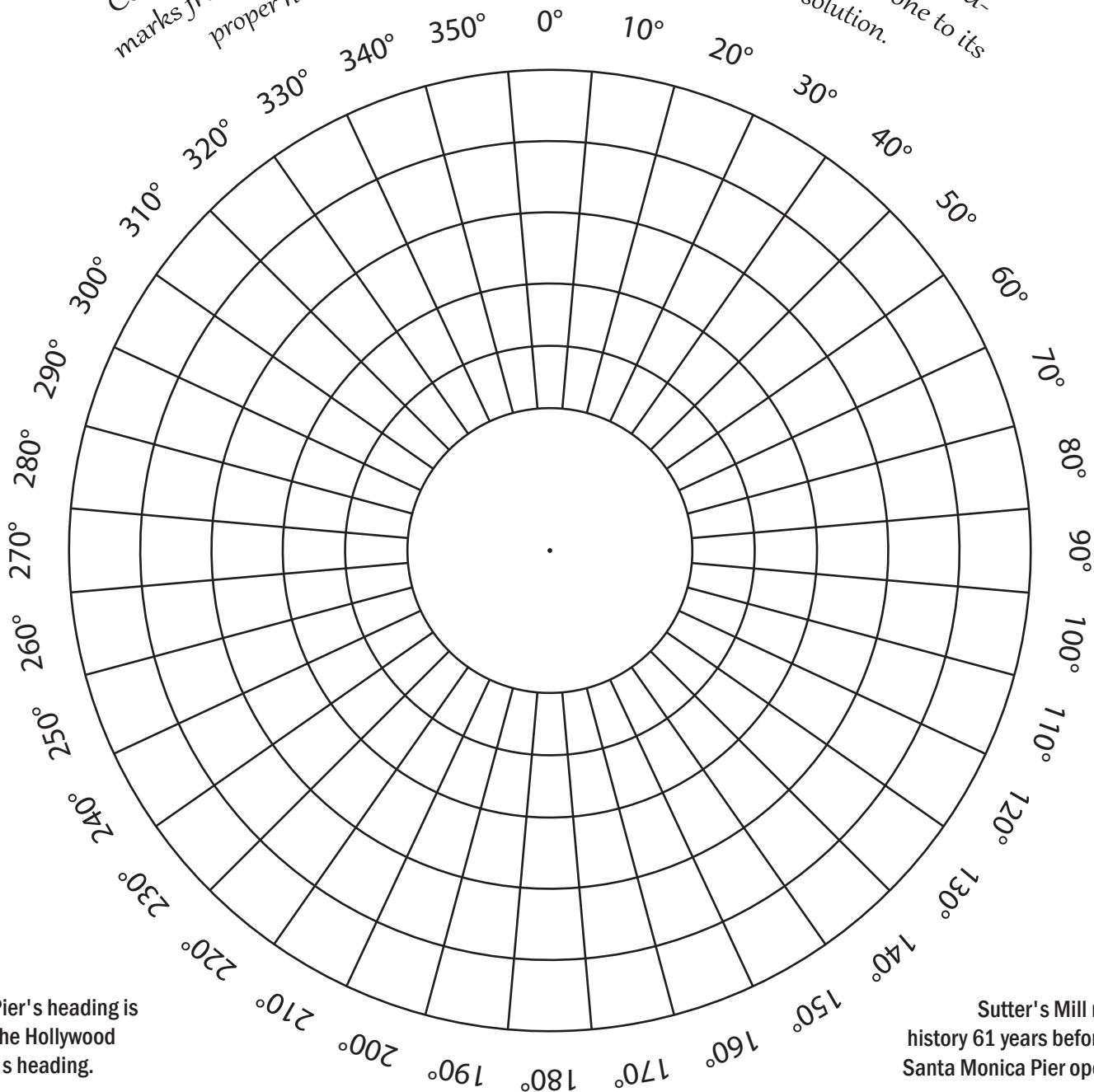
## 4. GET YOUR BEARINGS

Sign's heading.

The two-digit year of Disneyland's grand  
opening is one half of its heading.

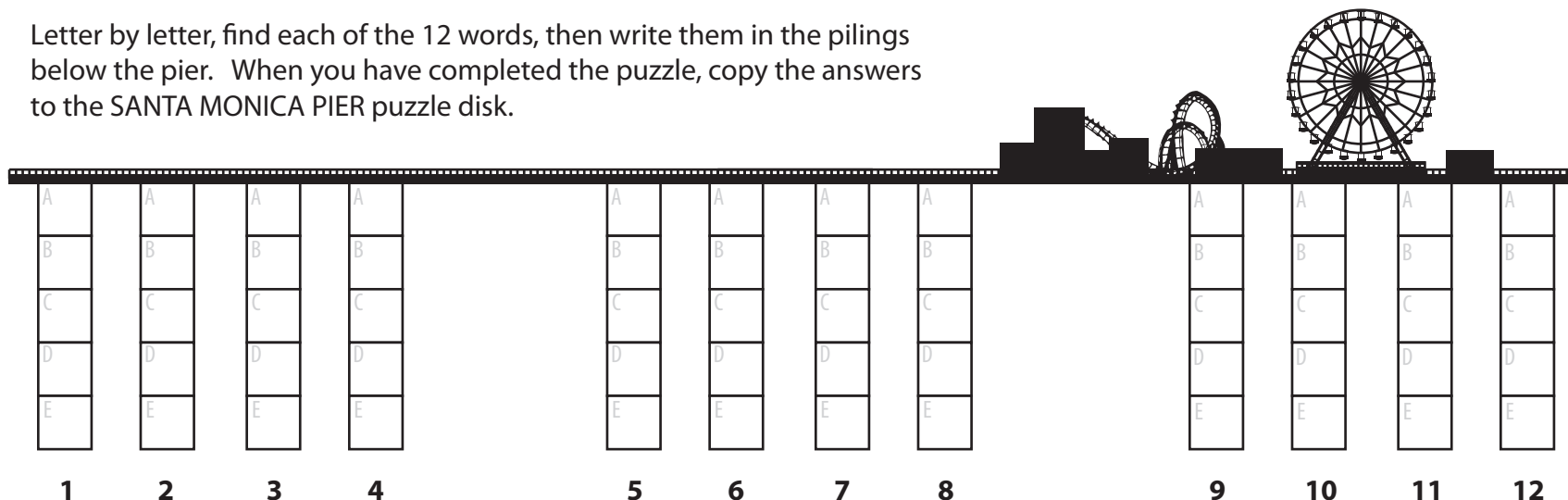
The heading for the Pier is 90° counter-  
clockwise from the Hollywood Sign, and  
50° counter-clockwise from Sutter's Mill.

The Hollywood Sign was erected 75 years  
after the start of the Sutter's Mill Gold  
Rush, but is not the most recent landmark.

The Santa Monica Pier opened on  
09/09/1909, 46 years before the newest  
of the landmarks opened to the public.

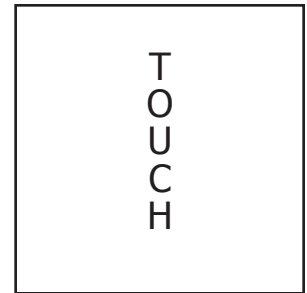

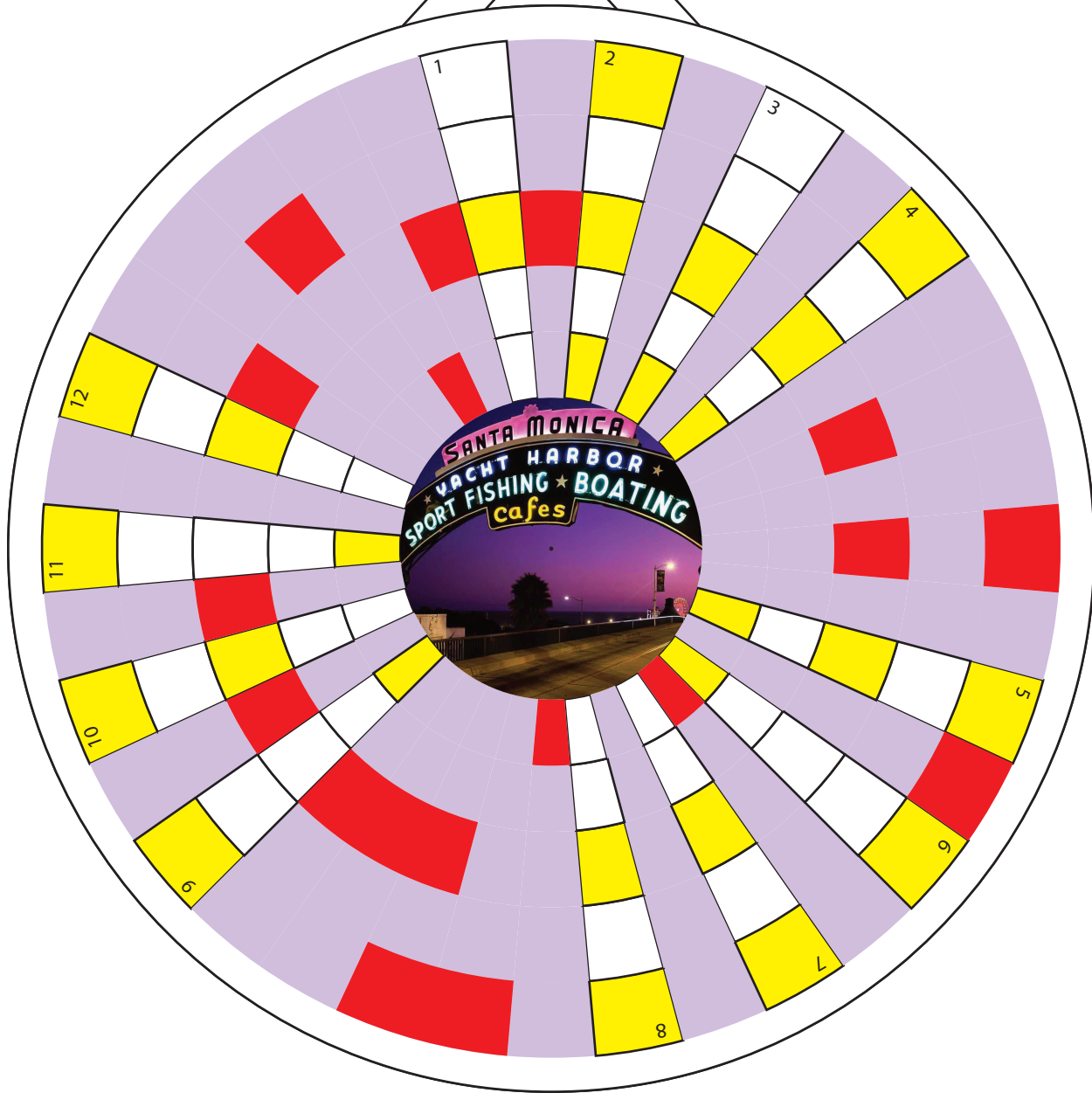


# GOLD RUSH

Name the images below and enter them into the Rings and Spokes of the SUTTER'S MILL puzzle disk.

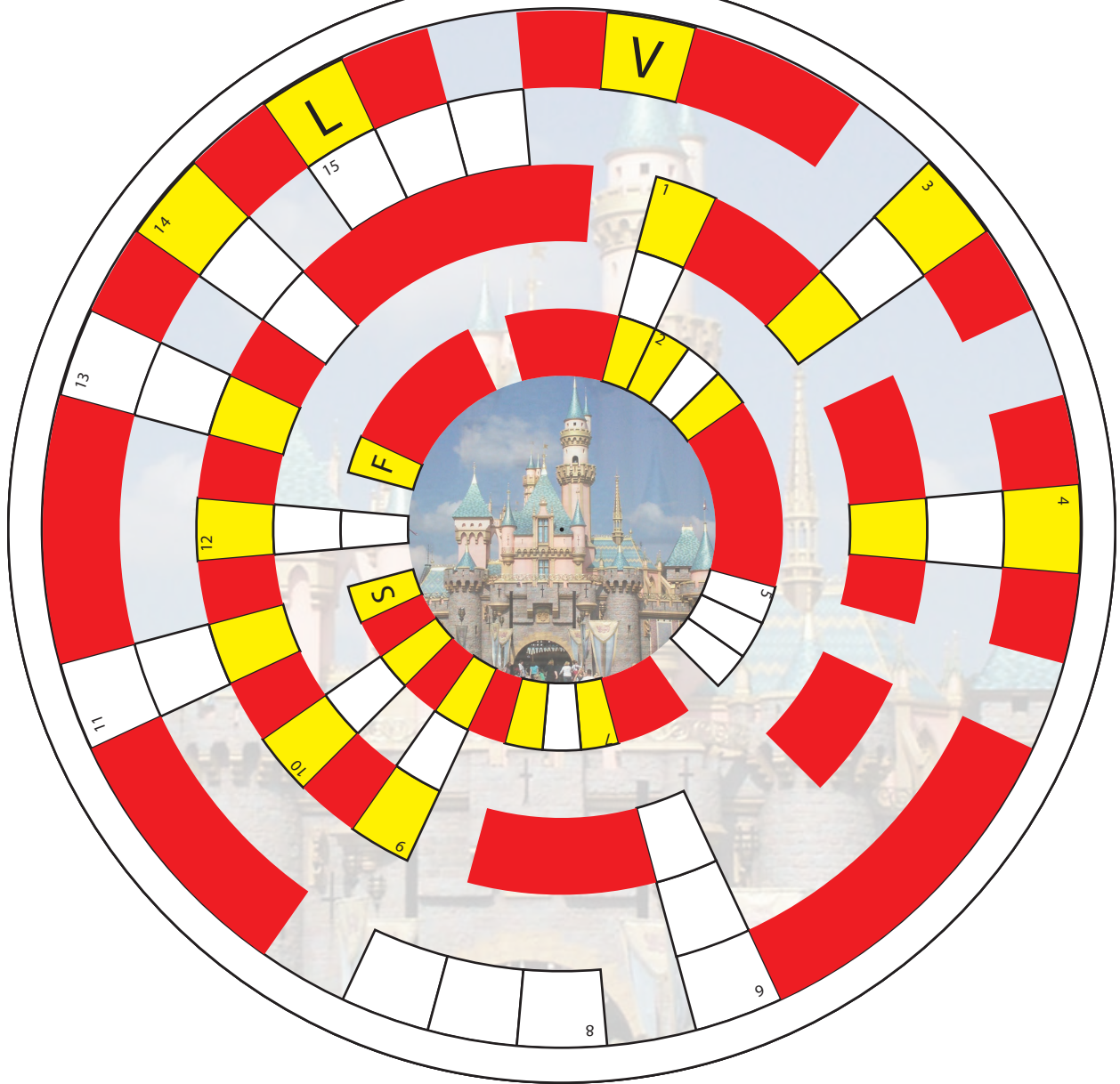

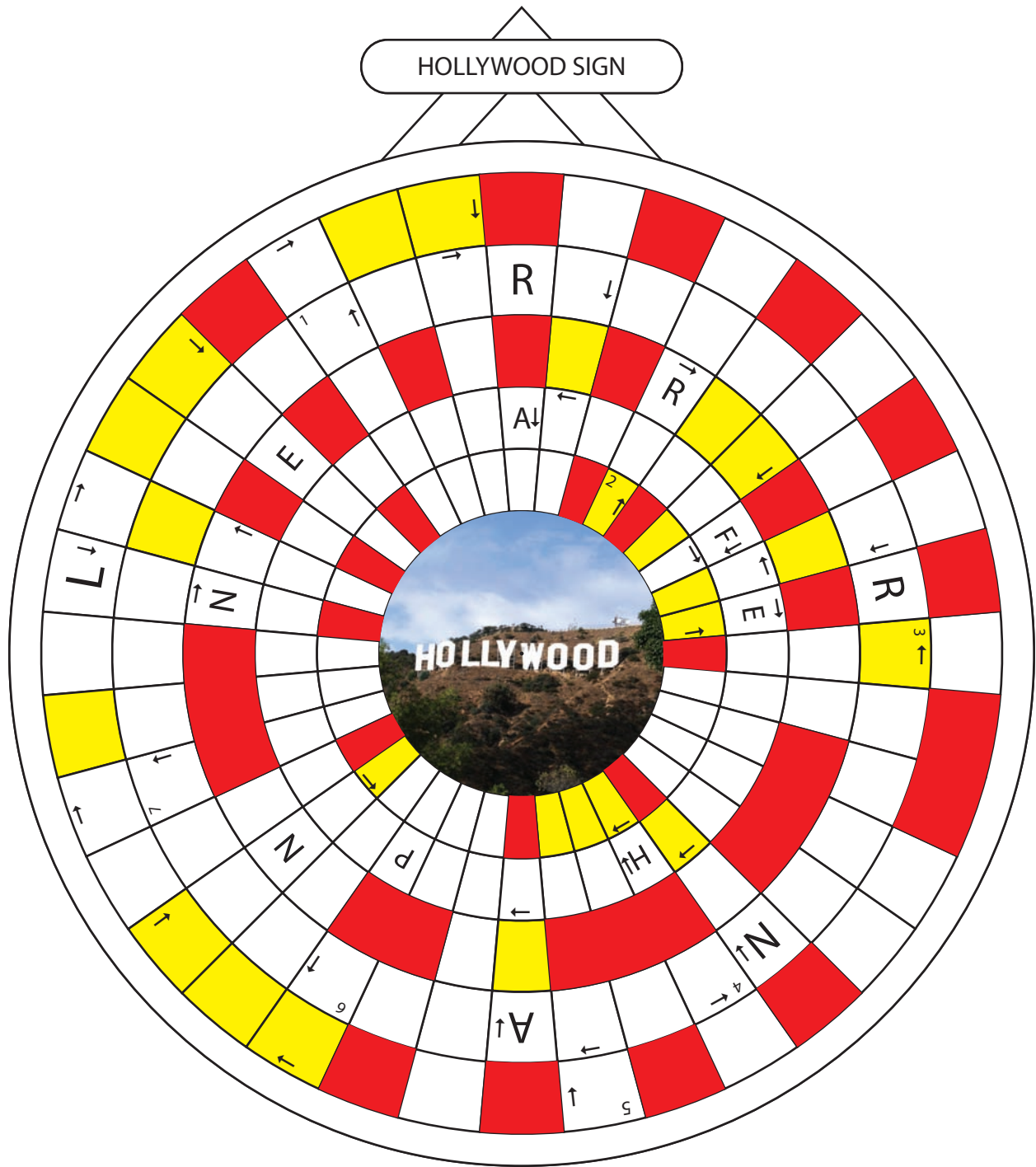
